SUPERINTENDENTS REPORT

- Jason attended the state all-star basketball tournament and we had two girls' teams win it all in 9U and 10U. First time ever, we have had more than one champ in the same year.
- Working with a couple who have applied for our Legacy Tree Program to have a tree planted in memory of their son. It will be a willow oak planted along the sidewalk adjacent to Little Shades Creek.

- We put together a litter cleanup day in conjunction with KVHB on March 11. Pickup spots were at Hwy 31 city entrance and on Cahaba Heights Road near I-459.
- The LVH and Barons baseball clinic is coming back to Wald Park after two years of being at Regions Field. It's the annual baseball clinic for special needs athletes. That will be on April 25 at 11am.

NEW BUSINESS

VHPR rec fees

President Myers stated the proposal is to increase rec fees effective October 1, 2017 due to capital improvements and increased operating expenses. There was also comparison to other communities conducted and fees were adjusted to be in line with other communities at 16% of operating budget. New fee would be \$40/resident and \$65/non-resident. Tommy Coggin made a motion to accept the proposal. Earl Lawson seconded the motion. In discussion, clarification was made that the sport boards would set their registration fees accordingly. The vote was unanimous, motion carries.

BSL contract

Earl Lawson stated that the current contract with BSL is set to expire May 26, 2017. The proposal would be to draft a new year to year contract that would include termination clauses in the event of pool repairs or a new aquatic facility. This would be reviewed by the city attorney. Earl Lawson made a motion to accept the proposal. Anne Smyth seconded the motion. In discussion, the pool hours will remain unchanged this year due to time requirement to ensure proper pool chemical application and testing as well as swim team practice schedules. The possibility remains that in future years, pool hours could be expanded through proper budgetary and personnel planning. The vote was unanimous, motion carries.
