Mayor's Report:

Girls Softball kicked off on Sunday. It was great. The Mayor spoke at the Senior luncheon on Monday, March 14th. He was excited to see 83 attendees. The Dogwood Festival was discussed.

Danny Marshall, also commented, it was a great opening day. The High School team came out.

Program Superintendent's Report – Sandi Wilson

Miracle League kicked off this past weekend. Basketball ended. We had 5 teams that played. All the girl's teams won or placed. We have a Senior trip coming up to Charleston, SC. It will be our first since Covid.

Brian Davis Report:

- Spring Sports kickoff was very successful. Thank you to the Park & Recreation staff for a job well done.
- Civic Center bridge arrived but is not in place yet.
- Ballfield Lights we are having trouble getting supplies for the lights. We had a quote of \$50,000 to replace the light bulbs. We are going to wait.
- Mud Boards will be arriving at the end of this week.
- Vandals burned the garbage cans at Central. We are in the process of replacing them.
- Scoreboards Buffalo Rock donated the scoreboards to us. It would be a very costly for the city to take them on and replace them. We can't afford to take them on. Buffalo Rock only has one to work on the scoreboards. Our crews are learning the workings and working on them. The Miracle League scoreboard was not working on Sunday. The Buffalo Rock contract is up in 2023.
- The equipment is at Dolly Ridge and the lights will go in on April 10th.
- We are in need of help from our boards to understand that the fields are theirs, please take care of them. Fields had trash on them. Mayor Curry commented that the parents aren't cleaning up after themselves. They are leaving trash on the bleachers.
- The pothole on Central field has been repaired.
- Dolly Ridge now has a monitor on site; paid for by the school.

Kirk McCulley – When we have groups that do not follow the rules, they will now have to go before the Park Board.

Mike Prociuk Presentation on Live streaming games:

We have been the BallKids and Anthem Buddies for the first two Legion matches, the first against MLS team Atlanta United, and yesterday on national TV (ESPN 2) against Tampa Bay.

- Across girls and boys there were (will be) 162 games from Jan 1 4/30 with a few more for our
 varsity teams the first week in May with the playoffs. 83 of which were (will be) on VH fields.
- Again, given peak team #'s, we have never had more practices and games.
- SHAC is an amazing resource as the only times we had to cancel on it were for severe weather and never for wet fields.
- But with that much traffic at SHAC, 3x a week access to Pizitz and a few times at VHEE throughout the season was vital to getting all this practice and game time on the fields.
