From Mayor Ashley Curry Celebrating 75 Years

I hope you are having an enjoyable spring season and that a March that "came in like a lion" will have left "like a lamb." We have many things to consider this quarter as we prepare for the remainder of the year.

We are eagerly anticipating the opening of new restaurants on the southern end of Highway 31, as well as substantial completion of the pedestrian bridge and the roundabout at Cahaba Heights Road and Sicard Hollow Road.

The most significant upcoming event will be the celebration of our city's 75th anniversary. The event is tentatively scheduled for October 2, 2025, and will be held at the Vestavia Hills Civic Center.

The City of Vestavia Hills was incorporated on November 8, 1950. From a humble beginning of a few homes atop Shades Mountain and a population of approximately 600, we have since grown to a population of just under 40,000 and a geographic area of roughly 20 square miles.

Our history, from its inception in 1950 until 2000, is well documented in the book entitled "Vestavia Hills, Alabama: A Place Apart" authored by Marvin Whiting and published and copyrighted by the Vestavia Hills Historical Society on the City's 50th anniversary in the year 2000.

The Vestavia Hills Historical Society emerged from the community's desire to preserve its history and was officially founded on January 8, 1987. Longtime Vestavia Hills resident Ruby

Landis Denson drafted the articles of incorporation, and upon approval, the Vestavia Hills Historical Society came into being.

There have been many developments in our history since the year 2000 – acquisition and development of Cahaba Heights, growth and restructuring of our city schools and the ongoing residential and commercial development in Liberty Park, to name a few.

As we prepare to celebrate our wonderful city, **I** want to recruit new members for our Historical Society. Planning for the Future

On February 24 and 25, 2025, the Mayor, City Council and City staff leadership gathered for two days of strategic planning exercises. The effort began with recognizing the value of our employees and their long service to our organization and city, followed by a comprehensive review of our successes and opportunities in calendar year 2024 and a discussion of the 2025 Citizen Survey results. After this review, the strategic planning session transitioned to forward-thinking efforts focused on three themes: (1) the City's growth to the east, (2) recognizing the power of innovation to affect organizational culture and (3) "dreaming big" to envision the ideal actions for the future without immediate constraint on resources availability. At the conclusion of the planning process, the Mayor and Council were asked to discuss and prioritize efforts for the next 12 months to make staff efforts and funding opportunities as effective and efficient as possible.

A review of the aforementioned 2024 data indicated many successes during the previous year. Customer service ratings from the biennial Citizen Survey and post-activity reports were notably strong and trending positively from previous annual reviews. Resident feedback was complimentary of attention to stormwater infrastructure, safety, education, recreation and library programs and facilities. There was a significant demand to improve the quality of walkability, transportation infrastructure and sanitation services. Following the data review, attendees strongly supported the fact that the City of Vestavia Hills is headed in the right direction.

An analysis of demographic and migration trends in the geographic region in and around Vestavia Hills supports the theory that from 2021 until present, the area generally east of Highway 280 has seen population growth while the area west of Highway 280 has seen static or reduced population demographics. This is seen most notably on the population growth map at right. It is further reinforced by growth trends in the analysis of residential and commercial new construction permit activity.


With these demographic trends in mind, various departments expressed the need for an enhanced operational presence on the east side of the City to properly serve residents in that area, including

Police, Fire, Library, Parks and Recreation and maintenance.

The City organization has long lauded the fact that we do more with less. With limited overhead costs and a focus on innovation and efficiency, the City provides a full complement of municipal services utilizing less per capita revenue than most other jurisdictions in Jefferson County, Alabama. (See the "General Fund Revenue Per Capita" chart.) Addressing east side growth demands will require intentional planning so the City remains good stewards of taxpayer dollars.

At the conclusion of informational sessions, the Mayor and City Council provided input to prioritize most, if not all, of the expressed facility and service enhancements. Further financial planning and scope evaluations remain as their prioritization potentially becomes an




