Happy New Year!

I don't know about you, but I am absolutely amazed at how quickly 2025 came and went. I have previously shared a popular quotation from Mark Twain, in which he said, "Now is the accepted time to make your annual good resolutions." I think he is also credited with saying, "New Year's resolutions come in one year and out the other."

The City Council and staff also have a few resolutions for 2026:

- Completion of the Highway 31 pedestrian bridge connecting Wald Park and the Library in the Forest. This was conceived over 20 years ago and appears to (finally) be coming to fruition.
- Completion of the lane-widening and sidewalks on Massey Road.
- Continued development of businesses on Highway 31 South, along with the beginning of improvements for the southern gateway to the City, including median work, landscaping and drainage projects in and around the Sybil Temple replica.
- Completion of the Veterans Memorial at Altadena Valley Park.

In a sermon a few years ago, Dr. Bill Brunson, Senior Minister at Vestavia Hills Methodist Church, asked the congregation, "Will the direction you are taking get you to your intended destination?" He, of course, was speaking from a spiritual perspective, but that same question could be asked of our city and our future.

As I ask this question of the vision we have for Vestavia Hills, I think we would all agree that we intend for Vestavia Hills to be a "Life Above," providing an elevated quality-of-life. The question then becomes, are we going in the direction that will lead to our intended goal? I am fully satisfied that we are heading in the right direction. We have a dedicated City Council, an exemplary City Manager and a superb City staff that work daily to improve Vestavia Hills.

During the first quarter of each year, the Council and City staff engage in a multi-day strategic planning session to chart the course for our city. I have no doubt that this year's session will include presentations about the projects planned for Liberty Park, including an east side police facility, maintenance facility and branch library.

In closing, if you are making a New Year's resolution for this year, may I suggest a resolution to volunteer some of your time or talent to the groups that contribute so much to the quality of life that we enjoy in Vestavia Hills. There are opportunities for all age groups with our senior's programs, library, schools, Parks and Recreation, civic clubs and churches, just to name a few.

Here We Grow Again!

As eastern Vestavia Hills continues to grow, so does our commitment to keeping the community safe. The Vestavia Hills Fire Department has been awarded a federal SAFER (Staffing for Adequate Fire and Emergency Response) grant, bringing 12 new firefighters to the department beginning in March 2026.

The grant will cover a portion of these firefighters' salaries over the next three years, allowing the City to responsibly and gradually absorb the cost while strengthening emergency response. This significant achievement was made possible through the leadership and efforts of Battalion Chief Scott Whitworth (pictured), who played a key role in securing the funding.



Growth isn't limited to staffing alone. Station 4 in Liberty Park is also set for a major expansion. Renovations are scheduled to begin in April 2026, with completion expected by April 2027. As part of this project, the department will add an engine company at the Liberty Park station, increasing daily staffing there by three additional firefighters.

Together, these investments ensure faster response times, improved coverage and a safer future for our growing community.



Vestavia Hills City Schools Hall of Fame

The Vestavia Hills City Schools Hall of Fame will add four new inductees this year to its list of legendary educators.

Inductees in the Hall of Fame's Class of 2025 include, in alphabetical order:

- **Marilee Dukes**, an English teacher and Debate Team coach at Vestavia Hills High School from 1983 to 2007
- **Frederick Jones**, a social studies teacher at Louis Pizitz Middle School from 1970 to 1989 who will be inducted posthumously
- **Carolyn Lytle**, a third grade teacher and reading coach at Vestavia Hills Elementary West from 1988 to 2008
- **Mary Bice Williams**, a fourth grade teacher at Vestavia Hills Elementary East and Vestavia Hills Elementary Central from 1970 to 1997 who will be inducted posthumously

This year's inductees were chosen from a field of nominees submitted earlier this year by alumni, current and former school employees, and the community at large. The Class of 2025 will be the sixth group of educators inducted into the VHCS Hall of Fame. A full list of previous inductees as well as nomination information is available at vhcs.us/halloffame.

Staying Safe on Scooters & Electric Bikes



Avoid Damp Roads

Wet roads will make the small tires lose traction faster than a vehicle would. Avoid riding on damp roads or during a rainstorm.

Stay Off Sidewalks

Sidewalks are intended for pedestrians and pets only. Therefore, scooters and bikes not allowed on City sidewalks.



... And Busy Roads

When riding in the street, you're going to be mingling with vehicles much larger and faster than you. If there is a bike lane, stay in it. If you are passing a row of parked cars, be careful of any driver who may be opening their car door or backing out of a parking space.



Watch Out for Grates

Unlike cars that can ride over sewer grates with ease, electric bikes and scooters have smaller tires that can get caught in the spaces. If it gets caught, you could very well end up flying over the handlebars!



Wear a Helmet

Invest in a good helmet, keep it with your scooter or bike and wear it every time you ride! Be sure to wear shoes too!



Stay Aware

As always, stay aware of your surroundings; put your phone in your pocket and don't wear earbuds. Practice the art of watching the ground in front of you while looking ahead of you ... It's a delicate balance!




Know the Law

Because Alabama law classifies electric bikes and scooters as motor vehicles, the following laws apply:

- Scooters may not be ridden on sidewalks.
- Riding on public street requires a tag and a valid driver's license (typically a Class M).
- Riders must wear both a helmet and shoes.
- The scooter must have functioning brakes.
- If you're riding on the street, all traffic laws apply.

Parents: Note that the law holds parents responsible if minors operate scooters without proper safety gear or in violation of traffic laws.

- Debris clogging storm drains can be a breeding ground for **rodents and insects**.
- Cleaning out clogged storm drains **costs taxpayers money!**
