CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

Happy New Year everyone! It is that time of year – a time that many of us examine and re-examine our personal and professional goals. The City of Vestavia Hills is no different. During the month of February, your elected officials will engage in a strategic planning session to evaluate the near-term priorities of City government.

While this is a regular process for Vestavia Hills, this year is notable in many ways. This year marks a “turning of the page” – moving away from implementation of the multi-year capital improvement program known as the Community Spaces Plan, to the City Council assessing its next series of priorities to improve our city. We all recognize that the investments in recreational facilities will require a programming element that remains a priority; however, many community input tools have brought to light the next series of priorities for investment considerations that involving staff dedication and financial investment. And, in our form of government, the elected body collectively charts the path on how to proceed with these opportunities.

It is refreshing that my staff and I get to engage with Council in this focused strategic planning exercise over two full days. This planning will guide our efforts over the next 12+ months and will chart the course for both our human resources, as well as our financial resources. While the priorities will be determined at the conclusion of this year's strategic planning process, I can write at this time what the surveys and public input gathering have highlighted as points for serious discussion. While these items are very important, they will also require significant commitment of capital resources within the City budget:

- Vestavia Hills residents have repeatedly called for **an increase in the number of walking and biking trails, as well as expansion of sidewalks**. 339 residents weighed in on sidewalk needs by engaging with our Vestavia Hills Listens portal, and our community survey provided feedback that trail systems are a top priority.
- **Public stormwater system improvements** continue to echo in the hallways of City Hall. Our city was founded in 1950 and many of the public stormwater structures have reached the end of their useful lives. We recognize that this same experience is being felt by residents who have failing private stormwater structures. While we are constitutionally limited in our ability to react to private matters, we can do our part in the public realm. This will be a large portion of the strategic discussions before the City Council.

- **We are blessed with a very well-respected public safety team.** Both the Police and Fire Departments get high marks from our residents. We have very expensive equipment and personnel needs that must be considered so that we can maintain this high level of service in our community. This does not include the safety demands associated with our traffic systems and the increasing costs associated with such expense categories.

My previous articles in the Community News have highlighted how the City of Vestavia Hills is a lean operation that functions admirably with the lowest revenue requirements of the region. Also, we have been able to remain AAA rated by outside financial evaluators based upon our extraordinary financial stewardship. These facts strengthen our ability to respond to infrastructure and safety needs. We are pleased to be able to react to the community demands and look forward to Council prioritization of actions that will resolve the challenges that we face. In future messages, I will highlight the results of strategic planning and the next chapter of community strengthening activities, but I also want to emphasize that these items for study and action will place financial demands on the City. The thoughtful and deliberate manner with which the City leadership addresses these concerns should give confidence to our residents. I know it does for me as my observation is that our strategic planning efforts produce great results that have been positively referenced by many neighboring communities.

MAYOR'S MESSAGE

I hope that all of you had a great holiday season and that the New Year is going well for you. Hopefully, your New Year's resolutions are still intact.

I remember mentioning in my newsletter from a year ago, that our city had several New Year's resolutions for 2022. In no particular order, we wanted to finish New Merkel House and renovations to Cahaba

Heights Park and Wald Park, as well as complete the infrastructure project (streets and sidewalks) in Cahaba Heights and to complete the new Civic Center. I am thrilled that the bulk of those resolutions have come to fruition with just a few items remaining to be done.

One of our resolutions for this year includes the completion of a passive park environment for the Altadena Park. These park improvements include the possibility of connecting walking trails, building a parking area and pavilion, as well as other amenities, such as a canoe launch into the Cahaba River, playgrounds and a disc golf course.

There will be other City initiatives for this year that will be more clearly defined as our Council holds our yearly Strategic Planning session this month.

One of our initiatives for this year is a revitalization of arts activities in Vestavia Hills. With the formation of an Arts Council, we will draw on the traditional arts events in our city, such as the Dogwood Festival, art shows and concert series at Wald Park. Our Arts Council will explore other ways to promote and encourage the arts and humanities in the City. We want to promote cultural events to include visual arts, performing arts, the education community and other organizations that promote arts events.

We also plan to house the Vestavia Hills Sports Hall of Fame in our new Civic Center. There will be future updates as this project gets underway.

This past month we experienced wide swings in temperature. We had record low temperatures with wind chill temperatures near zero degrees. A week later we had sunny days with temperatures in the 70s. It reminded me of the old adage that if you don't like the weather in Alabama, stick around a day or two and it will change.

Well, we will have to see what happens on Ground Hog Day, February 2. Maybe Punxsutawney Phil will give us some indication of what to expect. We will wait to see if he sees his shadow.

Regardless of the weather, it is nice to know that Valentine's Day is February 14. It is certainly one holiday that's sure to warm hearts. Take time to show some love to others in addition to your own significant other.

 - Rotting leaves cause **algae blooms in water bodies**, harming plants and animals and reducing water quality.
- Debris clogging storm drains can be a breeding ground for **rodents and insects**.
 - Cleaning out clogged storm drains **costs taxpayers money**.
