CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

I don't mean to be a broken record; however, those that know me understand the strong held principles that buoy my leadership as City Manager. One such, often repeated principle, is that a successful city develops an intentional, emotional connection with its residents. The use of the word "love" will then become a regular part of the vocabulary when describing the engagement with such a city. Over the last several weeks, it has been gratifying to experience many expressions that demonstrate this "love."

In March of this year, the City hosted a design charrette to inclusively and openly develop a reimagined plan for the south end of Highway 31 in Vestavia Hills. Residents, commercial property owners and potential investors actively participated with great enthusiasm to chart an achievable course forward on a much-maligned area of our city. In a post-charrette evaluation, an online survey was offered to individuals so they could weigh-in on the direction established by the charrette generated ideas. In April, the two largest events that are a part of the annual Dogwood Festival wrapped up two months of community building activities. Both the annual Wing Ding and Heights Hangout were rousing successes. There is a lot of "love" going around as evidenced by the early closing of entry gates at Wing Ding due to an all-time record consumption of chicken wings and the 22% increase in ticket sales (2,000+ attendees) at Heights Hangout.

I hope we can build on these successes and continue an attitude that sustains and grows the love affair with our city. There is a lot to love about Vestavia Hills.

MAYOR'S MESSAGE

I am excited to share a bit about the significant events that took place during the past month.

The Vestavia Hills Beautification Board hosted the 44th annual Vestavia Belles Presentation at Vestavia Country Club. Each year the newly-selected Belles are introduced, and the junior and senior class Belles are recognized for their years of service.

Between their duties serving as hostesses at City events and their volunteer time each summer at the Library in the Forest, these young ladies provide outstanding service to our city.

The First Responders Picnic, sponsored by the Vestavia Hills Sunrise Rotary Club, was held on the lawn at City Hall. This annual event recognizes our city's first responders and their families. It is very important to recognize the families in addition to the first responders themselves, as they live with constant concern about the safety of their loved ones. I salute these families and the men and women of our police and fire departments.

I attended the VHHS Awards Day on April 19 and participated in the athletic awards that were presented by Coach Buddy Anderson. As you may recall, three VHHS football coaches were killed in an automobile accident in August of 1971. In September of 1971, the City passed Resolution 332 which honors coaches Thomas Harold Ward, Robert Cooper Ray and Phillip M. Puccio. These awards are given to deserving male and female athletes as selected by the VHHS Athletic Department. It is fitting that Coach Buddy Anderson presents these awards as he represents the character and leadership attributes that these three coaches instilled in our student athletes. Congratulations to this year's recipients and thank you, Coach Anderson.

At our high school graduation on May 23, I challenged the graduates to be "significant" as they pursue success in their respective careers. I used Dr. Albert Sweitzer as an example. He left a distinguished career as a theologian, professional musician and medical doctor in Strasbourg, Austria to become a medical missionary in Africa. At a commencement address for a boy's school, Dr. Sweitzer stated, "I do not know what your destiny will be, but I do know the only ones among you who will be truly happy are those who will have sought and found how to serve others."

Father's Day is always celebrated on the third Sunday in June. This year it will be Sunday, June 18. Father's Day began in 1910, two years after the first official celebration of Mother's Day. Last month we celebrated Mother's Day, so let's not forget to recognize our fathers this month.

Finally, we must remember to celebrate our nation's Independence Day on July 4. I hope you will join us as we celebrate the founding of our country at the "I Love America" event on the evening of June 22 at Wald Park. There will be free swimming at the Vestavia Hills Aquatic Complex, sponsor booths, children's activities sponsored by Vestavia Hills Methodist Church, a live musical performance and an amazing fireworks show!

We should never take our freedoms for granted and we should understand that with those freedoms come great responsibilities. We should pass this on from generation to generation so freedom's light will forever burn in the hearts and minds of every American.

> Swim Lessons

Swimming lessons teach children self-confidence, encourage physical fitness and reduce drowning risk. We offer a variety of swim lessons at the Vestavia Hills Aquatic Complex for first-time swimmers to experienced swimmers who need help working on their strokes!

Swim Lessons will be available June 5-15, June 19-29, July 10-20 and July 24-August 3. The cost is \$120 per 8-day session. Classes will be held Monday-Thursday, with Friday as a make-up day in case of inclement weather. Classes will begin daily at 8am and last approximately 30 minutes.

- > Beginner Swim Lessons: This is a beginner swim class or level 1 and intro to swimming. This is for children who cannot put their faces in the water or float.
- > Intermediate Swim Lessons: This swim class is for children between the ages of 5-11 who know how to put their faces in the water and can float. These children can have some forward progress in the water with no help from someone or a flotation device.
- > Advanced Swim Lessons: This level of lessons is for an advanced swimmer who can swim across the pool but needs help refining their stroke and learning new strokes.


