CITY MANAGER'S REPORT

For those pop culture junkies, you may remember Colonel John "Hannibal" Smith who was the leader of the fictional group in the NBC series, *The A-Team.* He had a catchphrase – "I love it when a plan comes together!" For those more refined and studious of you, author and Adobe Chief Strategy Officer, Scott Belsky, writes in his book "Making Ideas Happen" about the art of action. He writes, "Ideas don't happen in isolation. You must embrace opportunities to broadcast and then refine your ideas through the energy of those around you." Regardless of your source of inspiration, I want to celebrate a plan coming to reality and the completion of desires

crafted collaboratively by capturing the energies of many Vestavia Hills leaders and residents. After many meetings and discussions, the Mayor and City Council launched the Community Spaces and Infrastructure Plan in 2017. This ambitious plan would become the largest capital improvement effort ever seen in the City of Vestavia Hills. Its focus was to improve the recreational and transportation infrastructure in Vestavia Hills in a transformational way. With the soon to be complete Wald Park Phase III (tennis, pickleball and dog park), the installation of sidewalks on Rocky Ridge Road and the final touches to the roadwork on Crosshaven Drive, the plan will be wrapped up late this summer. Our residents have and will enjoy a state-of-the-art aquatics complex, a civic center that provides capacity for the strong demand for quality-of-life activities, multiple athletic fields to support an ever-growing number of participants, and roads and sidewalks that make it easier for vehicles and pedestrians to navigate to their chosen destinations. While this celebration can be had by observing the tangible results associated with idea/plan completion, I want to highlight that our "field of dreams" has translated into quantifiable engagement with these assets in a way many may not see as clearly.

This morning, I drove the Crosshaven corridor only to observe numerous individuals running on the Crosshaven sidewalks while dogs were being walked and senior citizens were getting in a morning stroll. The nearly 11,000 cars that utilize the Crosshaven corridor every day are not inconvenienced by a delay from left-hand turners. The new asphalt from major street resurfacing efforts, the like Vestavia Hills has never seen before, provided a smooth ride (admittedly many more miles of resurfacing are on the books) as I ultimately passed the Vestavia Hills Aquatic Complex with a full parking lot. It has become the home of over 3,000 members. The new Vestavia Hills Civic Center has become the home of over 2,000 members and hosted approximately 120 events since its opening last December. Countless senior activities are scheduled daily at the New Merkel Senior Center and are a regular part of activities at the Civic Center. Dog lovers have the opportunity to share outdoor venues at SHAC, Cahaba Heights and soon will have that opportunity at Wald Park. The numbers participating in athletic team engagement at the new and upgraded diamonds, rectangles and courts are very noteworthy. At this point in the program year, there have been 5,453 athletic participants on approximately 600 different sports teams. The field usage varies by asset; however, some are approaching an incredible 75% usage rate.

Obviously, we have something special cooking in Vestavia Hills. We should be proud of the accomplishments seen since 2017. These accomplishments were made despite COVID-related difficulties and a challenging construction environment. Let's celebrate these successes and embrace Hannibal Smith's catchphrase, it truly is great to see a plan come together! Thank you, Vestavia Hills Mayor and City Council, community stakeholders and believers of the concept that ideas can become reality.

On June 21, the City received a letter from the State of Alabama Department of Senior Services stating that Ruby had been selected for induction as a permanent member of the Alabama Senior Citizens Hall of Fame. She is one of 10 individuals

selected annually and will be inducted on Sunday, August 20 during the annual awards ceremony in Montgomery, Alabama. As Mayor and a longtime friend, I have seen her impact on the lives of our senior citizens. Congratulations to Ruby for this recognition and for her continued work with our seniors.

We also want to recognize State Senator J.T. "Jabo" Waggoner and his wife, Marilyn. They are longtime residents of Vestavia Hills and have contributed so much to our community. STAY SAFE THIS SUMMER!

Summertime is a great time to light up the grill and throw on some burgers, hot dogs or whatever meal your taste buds desire. Though it can be fun to grill while relaxing with family and friends, caution

should be taken to prevent any accidents. House fires are an unfortunate result when grills are not properly used. According to the National Fire Protection Association, U.S. fire departments responded to 11,421 fires involving grills from 2017-2021.



The Vestavia Hills Fire Department wants to offer the following tips so everyone stays safe:

- Propane and charcoal grills should only be used outside of a structure.
- 2. Place all grills at least 10 feet away from any building, eaves or overhanging branches.
- Keep your grill clean by removing excess grease or fat buildup from the grates.
- 4. Never leave your grill unattended.
- Only use charcoal starter fluid to <u>start</u> a fire. Never add any charcoal starter fluid (or any flammable liquid) to an ongoing fire. This could lead to serious burns.
- 6. If you have a gas grill, make sure the lid is open before lighting it. If the lid is closed, gas can build up, which can create a fireball and lead to serious burns.
- 7. When you are finished grilling, let the coals cool completely for 24 hours before placing in a metal container. Do not put ashes in a plastic trash can before allowing them to completely cool.
- 8. Always have a multi-purpose extinguisher close by, just in case the fire becomes too big. Do not put water on a grease fire.



Items available to be collected include: electronics and household hazardous waste. (Proof of Vestavia Hills residency is required for hazardous waste disposal.) Paper shredding services will also be available and Vestavia Hills police officers will be on-site to collect unneeded or expired medications for disposal. (Needles will NOT be accepted.)


Electronic items to be accepted include: PCs and laptops; servers; cell phones and tablets; satellite and cable boxes; gaming systems and components; stereos and radios; switches and firewalls; printers and fax machines; VCRs and DVD players; remote controls; MP3 players; A/C adapters and other cables; LCD monitors; CRT monitors*; ink and toner cartridges; rechargeable batteries; hard drives, including external drives*; speakers; cameras; modems and routers; CD players; small kitchen appliances; consumer electronics; battery backups; keyboards and mice; stand-alone copiers*; and TVs* (*Fee required for the disposal of these items: hard drive and CRT monitors: \$10 each; televisions: \$20 each)

Household hazardous waste items to be accepted include: paint; batteries (household and automotive); light bulbs; and pesticides. Paint and pesticides MUST be in their original containers or they will NOT be accepted. Proof of Vestavia Hills residency required for hazardous waste disposal.

Not accepted: large appliances; wooden console TVs; gas; gas cans*; paint/pesticides NOT in their original container

*Empty gas cans will be collected with your household trash. Be sure to remove the lid/nozzle and place the items in your trash cart. Unemptied gas cans may be left open until the gas evaporates. Be sure the can is open in a well-ventilated area. If you are unsure about how to safely allow the gas to evaporate, contact VHFD at 205.978.0225.
